The Revd William Peter WRIGHT (1869 – 1944)

Represented the Cleveland and North Yorkshire Association on the Central Council
from 1904 - 1911, from 1913 - 1919, in 1923, from 1930 - 1931
and attended 2 meetings

William Peter Wright was born in Sheffield in 1869.

In 1881 he was a boarder at Repton School in Derbyshire and by 1891 he had been ordained and was curate of Stokesley, Yorkshire. In 1901 he was the Vicar of Stokesley, where he lived with his wife and two children. By 1911 he was the Vicar of Hemingborough, Yorkshire.

In the Ringing World notice of his death he was described as a 'practical ringer', but it is not known when he learned to ring.

He died at Eyam Hall, Derbyshire on April 8th 1944.
